Skansen is the oldest open air-museum in the world. It was founded in 1891 by Artur Hazelius to show how people lived in Sweden from the 17th century onwards. About 150 buildings from all over Sweden have been taken down and moved to Skansen. There are Scandinavian wild animals in the zoo area and livestock around the farmsteads. Skansen Aquarium is home to exotic animals, and the Children's Zoo has pets and small reptiles. In the Baltic Sea Science Center you can walk around and under large aquariums and see what's under the surface. Skansen is situated in a large park, with gardens and flowerbeds around the historic houses. There are also concert venues, restaurants, playgrounds and shops. Skansen is a non-profit foundation and the entrance fee goes to maintaining and developing the buildings, the animal enclosures, the gardens and the events and festivals all year round. Every year around 1,4 million guests visit Skansen.
